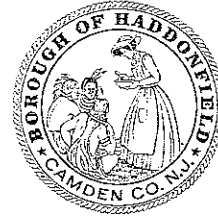

## **Borough of Haddonfield**

Camden County, New Jersey

To: Properties abutting Chestnut Street (from East Park Ave to Lincoln Ave)

Re: Planned Paving and Concrete Project

The Borough Commissioners have authorized the complete reconstruction of Chestnut Street from East Park Avenue to Lincoln Avenue. The project will include the installation of a concrete raised intersection, with clay brick pavers at the intersection of Chestnut Street and Lincoln Avenue. This raised intersection is the third and final traffic calming measure for Lincoln Avenue. The three raised intersections were recommended in a traffic calming report issued by Parsons Brinkerhoff. The report was commissioned and paid for by the State Department of Transportation. Grant funds from the State have assisted in the construction of all three raised intersections.

The raised intersection will require the installation of a new storm sewer pip that will run from East Atlantic Avenue along East Park Avenue to Chestnut Street and then to the new raised intersection at Lincoln Avenue. Also included in the project will be the replacement of older sewer laterals and older individual water services, installation of new concrete curbing, new concrete driveway aprons, the resetting of existing slate curbing and brick sidewalks and the complete reconstruction of the asphalt pavement in the project area.

We would like to remind each homeowner in the project area that they are still responsible for the water service and sewer lateral from their house to the newly installed house shut-off and cleanout; however, a construction project such as this one is always a good time to consider having your plumber (or other qualified contractor) replace the remaining older piping.

Jads Construction of South River, NJ will do the road work. The contractor advised us that he could begin the job as early as July 27, unless there are weather delays. You should receive a notice from the contractor at least 24 hours prior to the beginning of work.

The construction area will be closed to local traffic only during the construction period. During the normal workday, starting after 7:00 a.m., there will be some

impact on parking and traffic in the areas where concrete work is being done. We ask that when your side of the street is under concrete construction that you park off the roadway on the opposite side from your home or on the closest side street. While the actual road reconstruction work is in progress no traffic will be permitted during the day. The road will be accessible in the evenings. We would request that all residents park on the closest side street. The Police Department is aware of this situation and will relax enforcement of the overnight parking regulations where appropriate. If you have any concern, please call 784-9161 for overnight parking permission.

Your patience and understanding during this sometimes-messy process will be appreciated. This type of road work is intended to have the least impact possible. The end result for the long term, however, should be worth the short-term trouble construction work always causes.


