To: Properties abutting Colonial Avenue (Kings Highway East to Lake Street)
Properties abutting Lake Street (Colonial Avenue to Grove Street)

Re: Planned Utility Replacement Project

The Borough Commissioners have authorized utility replacement work for both blocks of Colonial Avenue and the one block stretch of Lake Street from Colonial Avenue to Grove Street. This work will include replacement of the old 4 inch diameter water main with a new 8 inch diameter main, including water services from the main to the approximate property line. The authorized work also includes the replacement of the old sewer laterals from the sewer main located in the street to approximately the property lines. . In addition PSE&G will be replacing the gas main along the two blocks of Colonial Avenue. According to PSE&G, their gas main replacement work will require the installation of new gas meter regulators in each home along Colonial Avenue. They have tentatively scheduled the regulator work to start on Wednesday, June 11th, with the new gas main installation to be beginning around June 23rd. A separate letter has been sent by PSE&G regarding their scheduled work. The Borough's contractor has been authorized to work in conjunction with the gas company to ensure a smooth transition through the construction phase.

Perna Finnegan of Newfield, NJ will be the Borough's contractor for the utility work. They may begin installing "test pits" as early as June 13th with the installation of the water main to start as early as June 16th. As always, the schedule is based upon good weather continuing. The contractor will also provide a notice a day or two in advance of the actual work via door hangers. The contractor will begin laying the water main down Colonial starting from Kings Highway. Once the entire new water main is installed and tested, they will begin installing the new services starting at Grove Street and working back toward Kings Highway. The contractor will notify each homeowner prior to disrupting your current water or sewer service and it is expected that this inconvenience will only last a short time. We suggest that you run your clothes washer through one cycle, without clothes, to ensure that any debris has been removed from the lines.

Roads will be closed to local traffic only during the construction period. During the normal workday, starting after 7:00 a.m., there will be some impact on parking and

traffic while the work is being done. On street parking will not be allowed during the workday on the block(s) the contractor is working on. Cars must be off the road by 7:00 a.m. Some day-time parking will be made available at the Lake Street pump station. Please contact my office should you have day-time parking issues. The Police Department is aware of this situation and will relax enforcement of the overnight parking regulations where appropriate. If you have any concern, please call 784-9161 for overnight parking permission. Trash and recycling will continue to be picked up on your normal day (Thursday). The contractor, however, has requested that all trash and recycling be picked up no later than 7:30 am, which may be earlier than you are accustomed to.

Your patience and understanding during this sometimes messy process will be appreciated. The end result for the long term should be worth the short-term trouble construction work always causes. The Engineer will provide an overview of the construction project, process and project updates every two weeks, which will be posted to the Borough website under the road program page located in the Public Works section of the website
